

Response of the State of Qatar regarding the report of the Secretary-General submitted to the United Nations General Assembly pursuant to the resolution entitled "Unilateral economic measures as a means of political and economic coercion against developing countries"

The State of Qatar opposes the imposition of unilateral coercive measures against any country in a manner contrary to the Charter of the United Nations and the principles of international law, including obligations under international human rights and humanitarian law, and the fundamental principles of the multilateral trading system, and in a manner that leads to adverse effects on human rights, economic and social development and humanitarian consequences for the population, especially the most vulnerable groups, and impedes the achievement of the Sustainable Development Goals. The State of Qatar stresses in particular the Oppose the imposition of any unilateral coercive measures that have negative humanitarian consequences or impede the delivery of basic humanitarian needs and the implementation of humanitarian activities. In this regard, the State of Qatar recalls the Declaration on Principles of International Law concerning Friendly Relations and Cooperation among States in accordance with the Charter of the United Nations and its support for General Assembly resolution 78/185, entitled

"Unilateral economic measures as a means of political and economic coercion against developing countries".
