






### Preferential Market Access - Norway GSP

Norway provides DFQF market access for imports from LDCs under its GSP scheme. The first Norwegian GSP scheme came into place in 1971, whereas the latest renewal dates 1 January 2013. DFQF for LDCs with full product coverage was introduced on 1 July 2002. In addition to LDCs, low-income countries with a population of less than 75 million are also granted DFQF access. Utilization by LDCs In 2012, Norway's imports from LDCs accounted for \$ 576 million. All imports are eligible for...

### Preferential Market Access: New Zealand GSP

New Zealand introduced its DFQF scheme for LDCs in July 2001. The scheme is part of New Zealand's GSP, which first came into force on 1 January 2001. Since its inception in 2001, all tariff lines are included in the scheme. The rules of origin for LDCs are more liberal than for various other preferential trading partners. Utilization by LDCs In 2013, total imports from LDCs were US\$ 99 million. All LDC imports are exempted from tariffs and quotas, either via MNF or via the LDC...

### Preferential Market Access - Canada GSP

The Canadian Market Access Initiative for LDCs came into force on January 1, 2003. With few specific exclusions, all goods imported into Canada determined to be originating in an LDC are granted duty-free status. Certain supply-managed agricultural products are excluded from duty-free and quota-free entitlement. Dairy, poultry and egg products originating in an LDC are not entitled to duty-free status. Utilization by LDCs In 2013, Canada imported for \$ 3,993 million...

### Preferential Market Access- Australia GSP

Australia provides for DFQF market access for imports from LDCs under its GSP scheme. The first Australian GSP scheme came into place in 1974. The DFQF scheme for LDCs became effective on 1 July 2003. All products are covered by the scheme. Utilization by LDCs In 2013, Australia's imports from LDCs accounted for \$818 million. In that year, at least 93 per cent of imports from LDCs entered Australia duty free, either under MFN (34 per cent) or under the LDC specific preferential...

### GSP - Generalized System of Preference

The Norwegian GSP-scheme provides exporters from developing countries duty relief when exporting goods to Norway. On this site you can find out if your products qualify for duty free import or reduced duty rates.

The GSP-scheme has been implemented for about 90 countries and territories, of which 35 are ranked among the Least Developed Countries (LDCs). LDCs benefit from more preferential treatment than other countries included in the system, the so-called GSP+ or ordinary GSP-countries.

Find out if your country has implemented the GSP-scheme

Note: in order for a product to be granted preferential tariff rates, certain standards must be met.

Read about the conditions for preferential treatment

### These goods are included in the system

All goods exported from an LDC are duty free when imported into Norway. GSP+ will receive a better offer than the ordinary GSP-countries. You will get duty free access for goods under Chapters 61-63, as well as 50 per cent and 100 per cent duty free access for certain agricultual goods.

For the other developing countries included in the system (ordinary GSP-countries), goods sorting under Chapters 25-97 in the Norwegian Customs Tarif are duty free, with the exception of certain textiles in Chapters 61-63. For agricultural products, regular duty rates are reduced by 10 to 100 per cent. Below you can find out which goods are included in the system and the tariff preference they are granted.

### Assessing the accession: highlights of Lao's package

### LDCs and trade in services



LDCs continue to play a marginal role in global trade in services flows, but their market share is increasing. In 2011, the LDC market share in commercial services stood at 1.05 %, only slightly below their share in merchandise trade of 1.14 %. However, whereas the trade balance of LDCs as a group in merchandise trade is approximately zero and even had a small surplus in 2011, LDCs are net...

The Canadian GSP scheme for the LDCs was revised in 2002 when almost all tradable items were made eligible for duty-free (and quotafree) treatment. Four excluded items were eggs, poultry, dairy and refined sugar, none of which is exported by Bangladesh. All LDCs that became beneficiaries of the Integrated Framework (IF), prior to the IF enhancement, automatically became beneficiaries of the Enhanced IF (EIF). 
